

Gifted Testing Nominations Open October 3 - 11

Grade 4-8 families interested in Gifted Screening are invited to contact our SERT (Special Education Resource Teacher), J. Longpre, to request a nomination form with an embedded link. Nominations are submitted by families through this link that will be open October 3rd through October 11th to receive nominations. Any families requesting nomination of their child after 9pm on October 11th, 2023 will need to obtain a private assessment or wait until the following school year to participate in DDSB group testing.



On October 18th, in partnership with wegrowfood.org, a group of intermediate students at WEH will be planting edible gardens in both the courtyard and the raised beds in the school yard. During this outdoor, interactive and hands-on learning experience, students will be taught by experts in sustainable gardening, about soil health, local edible plants and saving seeds to build seed libraries for future planting.



Student Accident Insurance

Families should however recognize that there is always a potential risk of injury with field trips, sports and other student activities both on and off school grounds. Accidents can happen, despite precautions to prevent them. Accidental injuries may involve medical, dental or other expenses not covered by provincial health care or employer group plans.

Please be aware that the Durham District School Board does not provide accident insurance coverage for student injuries. For your convenience, we do make available a Student Accident Insurance program through Old Republic Insurance Company of Canada. This program offers a variety of plans and benefits at affordable prices.

Who is Eligible?

Children are eligible for coverage if they are:

- a) more than 6 months old;
- b) less than 27 years old; and
- c) live in Canada, except the province of Quebec.

If a child is 14 years old or older at any time during the Coverage Period, they must be a full-time student within the 12 months prior to any claim. We define a full-time student as being enrolled in a minimum of 3 courses at the same time, during any 4-month period.

If you have children enrolled in different schools or school boards, they may all be insured under one policy.
