We encourage all parents/guardians of SK – 12 students to login to the Parent Portal and complete the Returning Student Registration Form.

Thank you to those parents/guardians who have already had an opportunity to complete this process and encourage all others to complete the online form prior to the first day of school.

This annual information review and update ensures that your student's school has the most up to date contact and consent information.

For students in Grade 7-12, the Returning Student Registration Form includes the **1:1 Chromebook Program Informed Consent** (CPIC) which permits your student to receive or retain a Chromebook during the first week of school. Without a completed CPIC, students can not be given a Chromebook.

If your student has SEA Technology, you will see the **SEA Technology Informed Consent.** This applies to students in all grades who have SEA Technology.

Please note: The Parent Portal and Returning Student Registration software works well on a tablet, laptop or computer. We do not recommend using a Smartphone to access this system.

KISS N'RIDE PROCEDURES

Please:

- Follow the designated loop
- Wait until the "unload/load" area before students exit or enter the vehicle
- Do not unload/load at curve (where the chain blocks the pavement)
- 3 cars will unload/load at a time in the designated area. Staff members will assist
- Do not pass other cars
- When all three cars have finished dropping off or picking up, they will exit the school and three other cars will move forward
- At the end of the day, if a child is not waiting in Kiss n' Ride yet but the car is there, that driver will have to exit the lot and re-enter the loop again
- Staff are helping exit and entry. Please follow their directions. Be patient! SAFETY FIRST! Here are some tips to consider:
- When children walk to school (where possible) it builds street safety skills, resilience, and an understanding of their neighborhood. Please consider walking to school
- Families may choose to park on side streets and let their children walk from there, building resilience and independence. Please, **DO NOT** park on Central Park Boulevard.
- We have many teachers on duty at cross walks and along the Kiss n' Ride. Students are never left unattended. Staff are on duty until all kids are picked up, and some students need a few more minutes to get ready. Consider coming a few minutes after the bell to allow some traffic to disperse around the school.

Please be patient and kind as we work together to ensure all students safely arrive and depart school.










KISSN'RIDEPROCEDURES DIRECTIONS MAP

Orange Shirt Day

Monday, September 30th, 2019

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of the account of a young girl, Phyllis, having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission. This has provided us with an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually. The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for the continued creation of a safe, equitable and inclusive school environment as the school year begins. Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come. On this day, we wear orange to remember the experiences of former students of Residential Schools and to commit to ongoing reconciliation.

Visitors

Visitors are welcome at WEH, however, they are required to check-in at the office and wear a 'Visitor's Pass.' This is an essential procedure to ensure the safety of all students. It is very important that parents/visitors do not enter the school at points other than the front door. We require everyone to respect this routine as we work together to ensure that we do not have the opportunity for strangers to enter the building.

Allergies and Medication

Please let the school know if your child has a severe or life-threatening allergy or medical condition. If your child requires medication or medical care while at school, please contact the office for the appropriate forms, which must be completed and signed by your physician annually. Medication must be stored in the office at all times.

Dogs on School Property

While pets can be valued family members, we ask that you please leave your dog at home, or keep it leashed on the sidewalk, off of school property. Even a puppy can have a 'bad day', and many of our students feel unsafe around dogs, large or small. It is best to avoid unnecessary accidents or uneasiness. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.





Parents, please discuss road safety with your son/daughter, and the dangers of crossing roads between parked cars around the buses. Students should not be crossing the road to go to the park to meet parents. Families are asked to walk to the end of the street and cross at the stop sign. We must not let convenience, or inattentiveness, create a safety concern for our children. We have several staff out on duty during entry and dismissal times, wearing safety vests and helping students cross our driveway at crosswalks.

At WEH we follow a Boomerang Lunch Program. Please use recyclable containers as much as possible. Anything brought to school in the lunch bag, should be returned home in the lunch bag.

- Communicate with my child's teacher(s). Ask questions.

- Model a love for learning, curiosity, creativity and a growth mindset: let them see you excited e.g. to read, pursue a hobby, visit a museum, sharing their day (their challenges and successes)
- Provide your child with positive feedback that builds confidence and provokes motivation to keep trying (e.g. I like the way you ... Wow, I notice how much stamina it took for you to ... etc.)
- When my child struggles or makes a mistake, let's take this as an opportunity for them to learn, try it again, fix it and move on.

Student Safety on the Schoolyard
